Luckily, we have a great team to support our racers and we'll be well represented at both Mid-Ohio and Watkins Glen. Race fans know that club racing often produces some of the best racing anywhere and these championships bring out the best-of-the-best within the grassroots world."

Winning a championship at either event is a major accomplishment. Winning in a Mazda is particularly rewarding as Mazda continues to pay out more contingency prize money to SCCA and NASA racers than any other car company.
