## STATEMENT ON SAFETY RECALL 6223J

## REARVIEW AND 360-DEGREE IMAGES MAY NOT DISPLAY ON CERTAIN 2024 MY CX-90 AND MAZDA3 VEHICLES

WASHINGTON, DC. (Oct. 27, 2023) – Mazda North American Operations (MNAO), on behalf of Mazda Motor Corporation, has filed a defect notification with the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) for a safety defect, which exists on certain 2024 MY CX-90 and Mazda3 vehicles.

Images of the front-, side-, and rear-view cameras may flicker and, in some cases, may no longer appear on the center display monitor. Improper processing logic in the view monitor camera control module may cause image deterioration.

Loss of front-, side-, and rear-view camera images when in reverse and/or using the 360-degree monitor can increase the risk of a crash. There is no warning preceding the occurrence of this defect.

There have been no reports of any accidents or injuries due to the defect.

2024 MY CX-90 - Approximately 10,782 units

2024 MY Mazda3 - Approximately 1,121 units
