

MAZDA STATEMENT ON MTM CX-50 PRODUCTION

Washington, DC (April 23, 2025) – Mazda North American Operations reports that Mazda Toyota Manufacturing (MTM) will continue to build the Mazda CX-50 for the North American market, with no changes to overall production volume.

While production of the CX-50 for the Canadian market will be temporarily suspended starting May 12, by increasing production for the U.S. market, MTM operations remain unaffected.

As Mazda's only vehicle assembly plant in the United States, we intend to utilize MTM to the fullest to support the growth of our business.

We will continue to monitor the situation, including government negotiations, market trends, and policy developments, and will consider flexible and appropriate responses accordingly.
